

Fighter Verses - Set C

Joshua 1:9 – To recite January 12 & 13

"Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be frightened, and do not be dismayed, for the LORD your God is with you wherever you go."

2 Chronicles 16:9a – To recite January 19 & 20

For the eyes of the LORD run to and fro throughout the whole earth, to give strong support to those whose heart is blameless toward him.

Colossians 3:1-3 – To recite January 26 & 27

If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God.

Colossians 4:6 – To recite February 2 & 3

Let your speech always be gracious, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how you ought to answer each person.

Psalms 27:1-3 – To recite February 9 & 10

The LORD is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? The LORD is the stronghold of my life; of whom shall I be afraid? When evildoers assail me to eat up my flesh, my adversaries and foes, it is they who stumble and fall. Though an army encamp against me, my heart shall not fear; though war arise against me, yet I will be confident.

Psalms 27:4-5 – To recite February 16 & 17

One thing have I asked of the LORD, that will I seek after: that I may dwell in the house of the LORD all the days of my life, to gaze upon the beauty of the LORD and to inquire in his temple. For he will hide me in his shelter in the day of trouble; he will conceal me under the cover of his tent; he will lift me high upon a rock.

Psalms 27:13-14 – To recite February 23 & 24

I believe that I shall look upon the goodness of the LORD in the land of the living! Wait for the LORD; be strong, and let your heart take courage; wait for the LORD!

Philippians 2:10b-11 – To recite March 1 & 2

At the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Philippians 4:6-8 – To recite March 8 & 9

Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things.

Psalms 30:4-5 – To recite March 15 & 16

Sing praises to the LORD, O you his saints, and give thanks to his holy name. For his anger is but for a moment, and his favor is for a lifetime. Weeping may tarry for the night, but joy comes with the morning.

Psalms 32:8-9 – To recite March 22 & 23

I will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go; I will counsel you with my eye upon you. Be not like a horse or a mule, without understanding, which must be curbed with bit and bridle, or it will not stay near you.

Matthew 20:26b-28 – To recite March 29 & 30

"Whoever would be great among you must be your servant, and whoever would be first among you must be your slave, even as the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

Matthew 22:37b-39 – To recite April 5 & 6

"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

Proverbs 15:1 & 16:24 – To recite April 12 & 13

A soft answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger.
Gracious words are like a honeycomb, sweetness to the soul and health to the body.

Romans 12:9-13 – To recite April 19 & 20

Let love be genuine. Abhor what is evil; hold fast to what is good. Love one another with brotherly affection. Outdo one another in showing honor. Do not be slothful in zeal, be fervent in spirit, serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints and seek to show hospitality.

Romans 12:14-16 – To recite April 26 & 27

Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. Rejoice with those who rejoice; weep with those who weep. Live in harmony with one another. Do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly. Never be conceited.

Romans 12:17-19 – To recite May 3 & 4

Repay no one evil for evil, but give thought to do what is honorable in the sight of all. If possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all. Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave it to the wrath of God, for it is written, "Vengeance is mine, I will repay," says the Lord.

Romans 12:20-21 – To recite May 10 & 11

To the contrary, "if your enemy is hungry, feed him; if he is thirsty, give him something to drink; for by so doing you will heap burning coals on his head." Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.

Proverbs 31:30 – To recite May 17 & 18

Charm is deceitful, and beauty is vain; but a woman who fears the LORD is to be praised.

Isaiah 26:3-4 – To recite May 24 & 25

"You keep him in perfect peace whose mind is stayed on you, because he trusts in you. Trust in the LORD forever, for the LORD God is an everlasting rock."

1 John 3:1-2 – To recite May 31 & June 1

See what kind of love the Father has given to us, that we should be called children of God; and so we are. The reason why the world does not know us is that it did not know him. Beloved, we are God's children now, and what we will be has not yet appeared; but we know that when he appears we shall be like him, because we shall see him as he is.

1 John 4:4b & Psalm 42:11 – To recite June 7 & 8

He who is in you is greater than he who is in the world.

Why are you cast down, O my soul, and why are you in turmoil within me? Hope in God; for I shall again praise him, my salvation and my God.

Psalm 55:22 – To recite June 14 & 15

Cast your burden on the LORD, and he will sustain you; he will never permit the righteous to be moved.

James 4:16-17 – To recite June 21 & 22

As it is, you boast in your arrogance. All such boasting is evil. So whoever knows the right thing to do and fails to do it, for him it is sin.

1 Peter 2:9-10 – To recite June 28 & 29

But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for his own possession, that you may proclaim the excellencies of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.

Psalm 96:1-3 – To recite July 5 & 6

Oh sing to the LORD a new song; sing to the LORD, all the earth! Sing to the LORD, bless his name; tell of his salvation from day to day. Declare his glory among the nations, his marvelous works among all the peoples!

Psalm 96:4-7 – To recite July 12 & 13

For great is the LORD, and greatly to be praised; he is to be feared above all gods. For all the gods of the peoples are worthless idols, but the LORD made the heavens. Splendor and majesty are before him; strength and beauty are in his sanctuary. Ascribe to the LORD, O families of the peoples, ascribe to the LORD glory and strength!

Psalm 96:8-10 – To recite July 19 & 20

Ascribe to the LORD the glory due his name; bring an offering, and come into his courts! Worship the LORD in the splendor of holiness; tremble before him, all the earth! Say among the nations, "The LORD reigns! Yes, the world is established; it shall never be moved; he will judge the peoples with equity."

Psalm 100:1-3 – To recite July 26 & 27

Make a joyful noise to the LORD, all the earth! Serve the LORD with gladness! Come into his presence with singing! Know that the LORD, he is God! It is he who made us, and we are his; we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture.

Psalm 100:4-5 – To recite August 2 & 3

Enter his gates with thanksgiving, and his courts with praise! Give thanks to him; bless his name! For the LORD is good; his steadfast love endures forever, and his faithfulness to all generations.

John 8:31b-32 – To recite August 9 & 10

"If you abide in my word, you are truly my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free."

John 8:51 – To recite August 16 & 17

“Truly, truly, I say to you, if anyone keeps my word, he will never see death.”

Isaiah 65:24 – To recite August 23 & 24

“Before they call I will answer; while they are yet speaking I will hear.”

Jeremiah 1:7-8 – To recite August 30 & 31

But the LORD said to me, “Do not say, ‘I am only a youth’; for to all to whom I send you, you shall go, and whatever I command you, you shall speak. Do not be afraid of them, for I am with you to deliver you, declares the LORD.”

Hebrews 3:12-13 – To recite September 6 & 7

Take care, brothers, lest there be in any of you an evil, unbelieving heart, leading you to fall away from the living God. But exhort one another every day, as long as it is called “today,” that none of you may be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin.

Hebrews 10:39 & Proverbs 22:1 – To recite September 13 & 14

But we are not of those who shrink back and are destroyed, but of those who have faith and preserve their souls. A good name is to be chosen rather than great riches, and favor is better than silver or gold.

Proverbs 26:20 – To recite September 20 & 21

For lack of wood the fire goes out, and where there is no whisperer, quarreling ceases.

Psalms 18:30-31 – To recite September 27 & 28

This God – his way is perfect; the word of the LORD proves true; he is a shield for all those who take refuge in him. For who is God, but the LORD? And who is a rock, except our God?

Psalms 19:7-8 – To recite October 4 & 5

The law of the LORD is perfect, reviving the soul; the testimony of the LORD is sure, making wise the simple; the precepts of the LORD are right, rejoicing the heart; the commandment of the LORD is pure, enlightening the eyes;

Psalms 19:9-11 – To recite October 11 & 12

the fear of the LORD is clean, enduring forever; the rules of the LORD are true, and righteous altogether. More to be desired are they than gold, even much fine gold; sweeter also than honey and drippings of the honeycomb. Moreover, by them is your servant warned; in keeping them there is great reward.

1 Timothy 6:6 & 2 Timothy 1:7 – To recite November 18 & 19

Now there is great gain in godliness with contentment. For God gave us a spirit not of fear but of power and love and self-control.

Psalms 37:1-2 – To recite October 25 & 26

Fret not yourself because of evildoers; be not envious of wrongdoers! For they will soon fade like the grass and wither like the green herb.

Psalms 37:3-4 – To recite November 1 & 2

Trust in the LORD, and do good; dwell in the land and befriend faithfulness. Delight yourself in the LORD, and he will give you the desires of your heart.

Psalms 37:5-6 – To recite November 8 & 9

Commit your way to the LORD; trust in him, and he will act. He will bring forth your righteousness as the light, and your justice as the noonday.

Psalms 37:7 – To recite November 15 & 16

Be still before the LORD and wait patiently for him; fret not yourself over the one who prospers in his way, over the man who carries out evil devices!

Psalms 37:8-9 – To recite November 22 & 23

Refrain from anger, and forsake wrath! Fret not yourself; it tends only to evil. For the evildoers shall be cut off, but those who wait for the LORD shall inherit the land.

Psalms 37:23-24 – To recite November 29 & 30

The steps of a man are established by the LORD, when he delights in his way; though he fall, he shall not be cast headlong, for the LORD upholds his hand.

1 Corinthians 10:31 – To recite December 6 & 7

So, whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God.

1 Corinthians 13:4-7 – To recite December 13 & 14

Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or

resentful; it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.

Isaiah 43:25 – To recite December 20 & 21

"I, I am he who blots out your transgressions for my own sake, and I will not remember your sins."

Isaiah 46:3-4 – To recite December 27 & 28

"Listen to me, O house of Jacob, all the remnant of the house of Israel, who have been borne by me from before your birth, carried from the womb; even to your old age I am he, and to gray hairs I will carry you. I have made, and I will bear; I will carry and will save."
